We all know it's easy to talk but harder to act. We need to encourage everyone to act on this and be a real advocate against abuse.

I'm happy and humbled to have the opportunity today to join such accomplished men on this stage to make it clear that we understand that this is not just a woman's issue and that men need to be strong allies as well.

You know for me, coming up in a single parent household, seeing my mom being abused by her boyfriend, I didn't really know what to do or how I felt about it. I was mad. I was sad. I didn't think I could do anything. As a little kid I felt helpless. But now that I'm grown, I believe that together we can help prevent abuse throughout the world.

We must work together, men and women, to help eliminate and prevent the abuse that affects so many innocent people today.
